That tremendous challenge only gets harder if we let reproductive health care slide backwards in our state. Another critical element is education. Understanding one's own body and rights as a person plays a huge role in preventing victimization and changing the ways our cultural tolerates abusers. That means we really need to do a better job educating young Alaskans on healthy relationships and sexual health. It's important to show our public support for, and open up dialogues with our young people about reproductive health. I support our Juneau Planned Parenthood clinic Teen Council, AWARE, and Becky's Place. I also applaud and support nonprofits like the Alaska Aids Assistance Association (4As) and their good work to prevent and respond to infectious diseases. 10. How important are reproductive health rights to you personally and why? Comments Reproductive rights are human rights—they're very important to me, and to my family. I'm proud to campaign - and to have served - as a pro-choice, pro-health candidate. I've appeared in the media at JPCC and Planned Parenthood events, spoken in committee and on the floor, and worked with advocates to head off bad bills and regulations from the Dunleavy administration. Our communities are more prosperous, more welcoming, and more just when everyone has the chance to make it on their merits. We only get there if the law treats women as fully equal human beings. Please use space below for additional comments or clarification. Along with the work described above. I serve on Alaska's Council on Human and Sex Trafficking. Traffickers sometimes use forced pregnancy to coerce women, so the right to abortion care matters in this arena as well. In this year's session I worked with colleagues on both sides of the aisle to improve our trafficking laws to deal not just with force or threat of force, but also those who "induce" others into labor or sex work by giving or withholding drugs, shelter, food, and other necessities.
